Sir,

At my request, the Parliamentary Recruiting Committee, representing all Political Parties working in conjunction with the Joint Labour Recruiting Committee are organising a great recruiting campaign to induce men who can be spared, to come forward voluntarily for service in the Army. If this effort does not succeed, the Country knows that everything possible will have been done to make the voluntary system a success, and will have to decide by what method sufficient recruits can be obtained to maintain our Armies in the field at their required strength.

Mr. Asquith pledged this Country to support our Allies to the fullest extent in our power. It was a pledge given on behalf of the Nation and endorsed

(2) If any circumstances arise affecting in any manner the accuracy of the particulars previously furnished by you for the purpose of registration. This must be done within forty-eight hours of the circumstances occurring.

This certificate should be carried by the Alien for production when required; if it is lost, notice should immediately be given to the Police.

MILITARY SERVICE OF GREEKS.

Please

The following notice is issued by the Greek Legation
in London:-

1. Under the terms of the Convention concluded between the British Government and the Greek Government all Greek subjects now in the United Kingdom between the ages of 18 and 51 are liable to military service.
2. The classes of 1905 to 1918 (men born in 1884 to 1898), both inclusive, have already been called to join the colours in Greece, and must leave for Greece before October 8th. They must notify to the local police authorities their intention to do so, unless they elect to serve in the British army.
3. Those outside the ages of 20 to 34 will obtain a certificate of exemption which will entitle them to remain in the United Kingdom until their class has been called up, but they must also notify to the police authorities that they will be ready to leave for Greece if and when called up.
