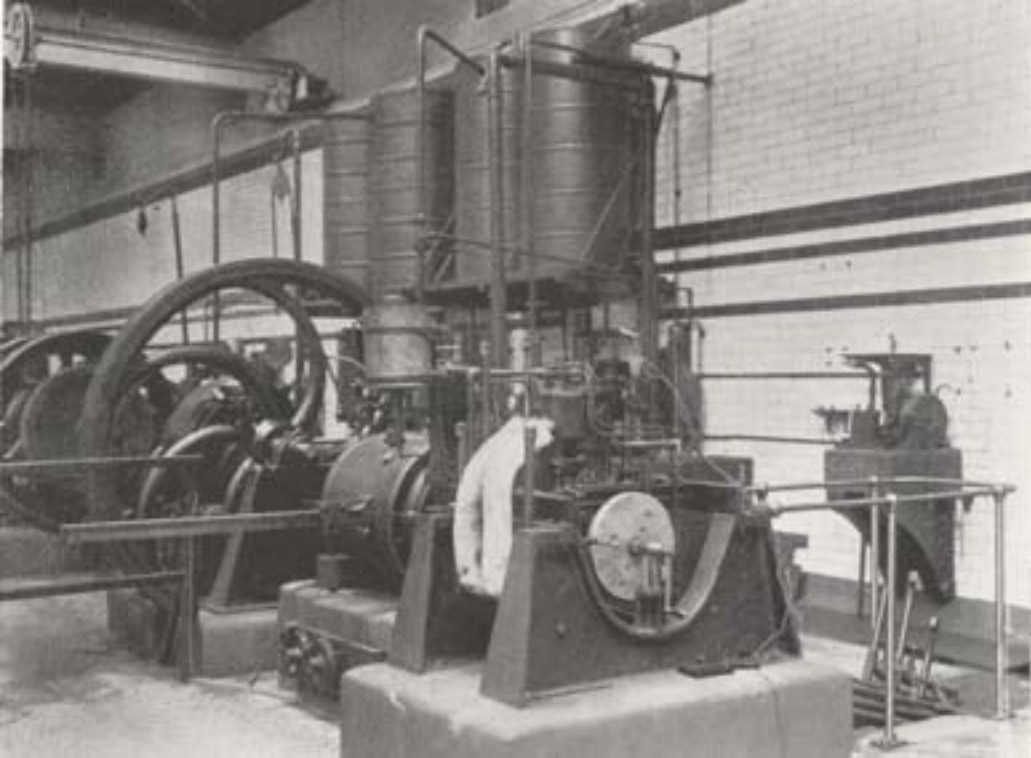

MILITARY SERVICE OF GREEKS.  
-----

The following notice is issued by the Greek Legation  
in London:-

1. Under the terms of the Convention concluded between the British Government and the Greek Government all Greek subjects now in the United Kingdom between the ages of 18 and 51 are liable to military service.
2. The classes of 1905 to 1918 (men born in 1884 to 1898), both inclusive, have already been called to join the colours in Greece, and must leave for Greece before October 8th. They must notify to the local police authorities their intention to do so, unless they elect to serve in the British army.
3. Those outside the ages of 20 to 34 will obtain a certificate of exemption which will entitle them to remain in the United Kingdom until their class has been called up, but they must also notify to the police authorities that they will be ready to leave for Greece if and when called up.
